Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I pray that you all had a very Blessed and Merry Christmas as we celebrated the birth of Our Savior and Lord!

By the time that you read this, there will only be about a month till your team leaves for Costa Rica. I thank you all so much for your prayers and support of this mission.

As I told you in the last article, we plan to start building a church for the village of El Mirador plus a parsonage for the church at Santa Rosa. The team feels blessed to be starting to build another new church plus the parsonage.

The team will be commissioned on January 27. This is the day also that we will be offering fruit for a love offering. As I have told you all many times, any money raised by this or any other, goes directly to buy mission supplies.

I wanted to give you all an update on the children's feeding programs that we support. They are being held in Barrio Jardin every week where approximately 50 children attend, Pital church once a week with about 60 children and lastly at Santa Fe with about 35 children. Each week they receive a meal and a bible lesson for their souls. These events would not occur without your support and prayers. We are hopeful and in prayer about starting a new site in El Mirador. Talking with and thinking about the needs of not only the children but the many poor people that we are serving made me think of these two bible verses:

Proverbs 28:27

Whoever gives to the poor will not want,  
but he who hides his eyes will get many a curse.

Isaiah 58:10

If you pour yourself out for the hungry  
and satisfy the desire of the afflicted,  
then shall your light rise in the darkness
