I am always ready to talk about how God wants to use His people for ministry.

Jobs include station helpers (Bible study, worship & drama, art & science, and games), meal service, early childhood leaders/helpers, van drivers, tech help, and small group leaders. We will be partnering with Ashland First UMC to put on VBS at our campus due to ample outdoor space. We hope many students and their families who don't yet have a relationship with their Creator will encounter Christ this week; and for those who do, we pray their relationships go deeper as they connect with God, nature, and community through this VBS experience.

Lastly, *thank you*. Your dedication to youth and children's ministry is greatly appreciated and extends far beyond us. I pray seeds are planted with every interaction.

Dear Church family,

Thanks so much for blessing the team with your prayers and gifts. None of what we do could be done without your help. There are just certain people from our church that are able to make the trip, but all of you are a part of what our Lord has us to do.

The team will present the trip at a later date yet to be determined. This is a brief overview of some of what we did. We were able to hold VBS for 225 children in three days. We planned VBS on Thursday but due to Covid restrictions, the police shut it down. We also were able to be a part of the feeding program in Pital. We helped feed 125 children. That touched all of our hearts in a profound way. Also men's bible study was held on Tuesday night at Martin's home. There were about 20 people at this study. Once again we were set to do the same on Thursday evening but were shut down due to Covid restrictions. I am sorry but do not have exact account of women's devotions and crafts due once again to Covid restrictions. The Pital Methodist church is still shut down.

On the farm, we removed a termite invested common area and replaced with metal. Painted the roof of the mess hall and Mary's house. One team worked on the multi-purpose building by pouring 11 yards of concrete, plus laying block walls. We cleaned the amphitheater and walking paths. We also saw new windows go into the technology building.

We felt like we were able to accomplish most of what we planned. Mary was so happy and told us how blessed she was to have us with her. We were the first team of the year, which made it even more special. Mary told the group that she was retiring in late fall. No exact date at this point. Pastor Jerry Russell may be taking over on an interim basis. Jerry was with us the whole time helping to lead and inspire the team, which he did! Jerry is a retired minister from Tennessee but has been going to Costa Rica since 1978. He has a real heart and passion for this ministry. We all are praying that the bishop of Costa Rica will appoint him very soon.

Plans were made to keep the children feeding program on going even after Mary's departure. Every trip I am amazed at what the group accomplishes. My fears and concerns melt away when I remember the verse, Isaiah 41:10, "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Please keep Mary and the Costa Rica people in your prayers. The decision Mary made to retire was very difficult for her, but she knows that it is for the best.
