By now, I shouldn't be surprised at how God works. But even after all of these years of being a Christian, even after all of the years of living into the calling of ordained ministry, I am still surprised. Let me give you 2 quick examples.

We were working through a situation at church. And I read the daily reading from Paul in the Fall and it applied to the situation that we were working through. It was August when I put together the reading plan and my consideration was on this, after reading the Gospels where is a good place to go? How about the letters of Paul? But God was at work and the text from the reading plan coincided with the situation that we were working through. And God spoke to my heart through His word.

As I was planning the Bikes and Backpacks fundraising ride, I wanted to charge \$50 per rider in order to cover costs for lunch and T-shirts and still have a strong balance to buy food for the kids. But in consultation with people who have done this kind of ride before, we were told that \$50 was too much and people wouldn't come and ride. So we reduced it to \$30. I didn't want to, but we did. And now, through the generous support of businesses and individuals, we have sponsorships that will easily cover all of our costs, and the full amount of the rider fees will go to buy food for the program. The concerns that I had about the costs of hosting the ride are all taken care of and I believe that we are going to be able to significantly fund this ministry for this school year.

The lesson that I am learning is that God is at work. God is at work! He doesn't call us into Kingdom work that He won't provide the resources necessary to do the work. He doesn't call us to engage in His Word without nurturing our souls in the process. He doesn't call us into discipleship without transforming our lives. He doesn't call us to be a blessing to others without giving us the joy that it is simply to bless others. God is at work! We have to be willing to recognize the hand of God at work.

# Saintly Solitude

## A Permissive Discipleship Thought from Pastor John

There are seasons of life, maybe you are in one now, where it seems like there is no downtime. For pastors that liturgical season is getting ready to begin. It may be beginning or already begun for you too. As I sit to write this article, I am looking at my calendar for today - it is non-stop. It is 8:05am and I won't get home until after 8pm this evening. Advent and Christmas are quickly approaching. Planning needs to be done and decisions need to be made, at work and at home.

I was reminded in one of my back-to-back meetings yesterday that even Moses found time to listen to God. **Read Exodus 3:1-6.**

Moses was at work, tending the sheep, when he noticed the burning bush (God trying to get Moses' attention). He approached the bush that wasn't being consumed by the fire and ended up meeting with the Lord. As I read the text in the meeting, two questions came to my mind: 1) How much time transpired between Moses seeing the burning bush and Moses "hiding" his face? and 2) Who was taking care of the sheep during that time? Sorry, I'm squirreling.

In his solitude among the sheep (during his work schedule) Moses made time for an encounter with God. How often do we miss an opportunity to encounter God because we are working with our head down, focused on doing for rather than being with God?

As Moses approached the burning bush, God stopped him in his steps and told him to take off his sandals. When I read that part of the passage, I think about the saying, "kick off your shoes and stay a while." How often do we only have a passing moment with God instead of an intentional time with God?

You may or may not need it, but, I give you permission to take time to be with God in your free time and, more importantly, in your busy/hectic times. My prayer for CornerStone, as we approach the busy holiday season, is that we would all be more intentional in spending time with God.

### *Questions of the day:*

- How can you intentionally make time to just be with God?
- What one thing are you willing to put aside so that you might have more opportunities for God to speak to you?



During September, we had the opportunity to encounter dozens of children and families in our community, some that we already knew, and many that we didn't. Our Kids' Fall Kickoff hosted over 100 people on our church grounds while the Children's Activity Tent at Poage Landing Days entertained more than we managed to count. Whether or not we ever see some of those faces again on this earth (yet hopefully we will!), my prayer is that families in our community recognize the church as a safe, welcoming place where everyone experiences love. I hope that through our actions and interactions—and ultimately the work of the Holy Spirit—these families encounter their loving Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer.

Dear Church Family,

I pray that each one of you feels our Lord's love for you each and every day. I know we all have so much to be thankful for.

As of October 1, 2022, there are 129 days left until your team travels to Costa Rica to be our Lord's hands and feet doing His will in that beautiful country.

There have been a lot of ministries going on at the camp and surrounding areas. Work continues at the camp with the renovation of camp facilities. Paul has started a feeding ministry in the very poor village of El Mirador. This area is close to the camp. We have worked in this village many times during our mission trips. Currently they are feeding children's stomachs and souls twice a month. They are averaging 125 children per feeding. The cost is about \$200.00 per each time. We were blessed to be able to send down \$200.00 last week to help with feeding the children. Paul is looking for churches to help sustain this program.

The Pital program is making great strides in feeding more and more children. The last feeding program had over 150 children. I feel so blessed that as a church we are sponsoring this. I know that God has to be pleased as HE looks down and sees His children being taken care of. Praise God!

Attached are some pictures from both feeding programs plus a picture of the propane cook top that we purchased for Pital. Also attached is a letter that Natalia sent expressing her thanks and blessing for our church.

I always think of this Bible verse when I see pictures of the children being fed or even more so when I am present at the event: Matthew 18:10 "See that you do not despise one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father in heaven." That verse sure makes me think.

Thanks so much for supporting the Costa Rica mission with your prayers and gifts. If anyone ever has any questions, please call me. I do love to talk about Costa Rica

Dear Brother Ed, brothers, sisters, and friends of this wonderful team,

The children's ministry "Pan de Vida" greets you. God bless you greatly; we would like to thank you for your unconditional support that you have given to us. We are very grateful to God for your love and dedication to this ministry. We also would like to thank all of you who support the feeding program that takes place every Friday, serving 50 to 60 children from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Three months ago, we only had the attendance of 20 to 30 children because of the pandemic restrictions on group gatherings, which made it very difficult for the children as many more wanted to come to participate in the program.

In this ministry, my husband Martin and I, Natalia, serve the children with love and dedication. There are also seven ladies or mothers who help us in the kitchen: Carmen, Nereyda, Elda, Sarah, María, Dalila, and Leivis, who are all great blessings. We also have the support and help of some young ladies, who in the past were participants in the feeding program when they were children. But now, they collaborate with us in this ministry. These young ladies are currently in school.

Once again, thanks for your support. Currently, we have only worked in the immediate community that is heavily traveled by refugee families who are on the move. These families are from different parts of the country in search of work. Thus, we always have new children in the community.

As always, we will be sending photos of our upcoming events and current updates.
