We have all said it or heard it said, "I've had an epiphany!" What we mean is a revelation about an issue. Maybe it is a problem we are trying to solve or some bit of knowledge that we didn't previously understand. And then it becomes clear...an epiphany.

On January 6th, we celebrate Epiphany. This is the day that we commemorate the arrival of the Magi to see the child Jesus. If you wonder why I called him a child and not a baby, be in worship on the 8th of January and we will talk about it. But for now, the thing we need to notice is that the Magi found the child and worshiped. I believe this was a transformational event in their lives. I believe they were changed forever.

We have just come through the Christmas season. We too have experienced the birth of Jesus, God incarnate, come to save humanity from our sin and restore us to a right relationship with God. My question is, how have we been changed?

This is the season of the year that people make new year's resolutions. People are trying to muster the will power to put a new practice in place in their lives that will make them better, emotionally, physically, mentally. But the thing about new year's resolutions is they are difficult to keep by our own will power. By 1 week, 25% will drop the resolution and by February 1, the average American will call it quits. Instead of making resolutions based on our will power, I want to encourage all of us (me included) to allow our Epiphany of Jesus to transform us.

We have all experienced him, his birth, his love and grace. Now, let's allow the Holy Spirit to change us. If we are simply trying to get rid of some bad habit, we will likely fail. But if we allow the Holy Spirit to replace that with a virtue that is edifying to ourselves and the body of Christ, we will succeed. Why? Because the Holy Spirit instead of our own will power is the motivation. As you begin this new year, seek God, asking the Holy Spirit to transform you into the person he wants you to be. And you like the Magi can be transformed by your Epiphany with Jesus.

## A Firm Discipleship Thought from Pastor John

Let's start the 2023 New Year off on a good note by reading **Matthew 7:24-27**.

About a month ago, I had mentioned to Clancy (the lead guitarist in our Praise Team) that I wanted to learn how to play the bass guitar. Being the always thoughtful teacher and encourager, he handed me a bass guitar and simply said, "now just learn the notes on the bass clef." Great advice and it is also a great biblical principle.

Being able to read the bass clef and translate that knowledge to the bass guitar provides me with a musical foundation that enables me to play along with the band. Having a firm foundation of faith enables us to make beautiful life-transforming music and it enables us to handle any and every situation that may arise in life. Not because we are awesome, strong, and powerful on our own; but because we have built trust in God, we have been transformed by His power, blessed with the Holy Spirit, and live in a nurturing community of faith.

Not only did Clancy get me headed in the right direction to build a firm foundation on the bass guitar, but Barb (our pianist) also added to my process of growth. She lovingly grabbed a Daily Bible Reading Plan bookmark and jotted down the notes on the bass clef. I am so blessed to be surrounded by a musical family (and yes, I call them family) who make time to guide and teach. I am also blessed by a great faith family (and yes, I am talking about you) who make time to encourage, teach and share life with me. With people like you around, that great hymn, "How Firm A Foundation," rings melodically in my heart and mind.

How can you build a firm foundation? There are plenty of ways to get started. Here are just a few:

- 1) Join us in our Daily Bible Reading Plan - being in the Word every day is transformational
- 2) Talk with God every day - conversation builds relationship
- 3) Practice a new spiritual discipline or brush up on one you haven't used in a while (i.e. fasting, meditation, simplicity or confession) - practice builds and enhances the foundation.

Let's start 2023 off on a good note. Forget about resolutions, those simply require your own will power; however, making a covenant between yourself and God (this brings Him and His power into the equation) to build a firm foundation of faith in Jesus Christ.




