And if the trip includes flying (or more importantly, airport security) the higher my anxiety level. But when the trip begins, the minivan rolls out the driveway or the airplane leaves the runway, I will then relax, because at that point it is what it is. Anything that is forgotten will have to be purchased or done without. Possibilities of security delays or missed flights are over. When the trip begins, I am traveling and all the what-ifs are gone.

By the time you read the newsletter, the anxiety that I am feeling right now will be over and 9 of us will be in Israel, visiting the Holy Land and walking where Jesus walked. But travel is not the only factor causing anxiety in the past weeks. We are in a time of anxiety in the Methodist Church with General Conference in session. By the time that you read this, General Conference 2019 will have concluded, and we will be on the journey of sorting out the implications for the local church.

Here is the good news. The people of God have been faced with monumental decisions in the past. We have made some of those decisions better than others. But God has continued to lead the church through them and we have carried on in ministry. I often think of the conflict that we faced 170 years ago over the issue of slavery. In that moment, we did not stand up for what is right, and the impact of those choices are still evident on the church, but we are still the church.

So, here we are on this journey. And we are now beginning to live out the reality of the choices that we made. But God is still God and God will still lead His people. It is kind of like when the wheels are up on the plane and the journey is on with no turning back. Our only choice is to live into the journey together. But most of all, I am glad that you are the people with whom I am on this journey.

I pray all is well with each and every one of you. I am still on cloud nine after being blessed by a week in the mission field in Costa Rica. The team was 46 strong this year and we were able to accomplish a lot of work.

As I tell each team, one of the most important parts of being a missionary is to be flexible! This year was no different. We had thought we

would start a church for El Mirador and start a parsonage for Santa Rosa, but neither one happened! God had a better plan for us, HIS plan. We worked on the technology building, painted roofs, security bars, doors, the cross in the amphitheater and windows. We also did some repair work in Mary's home, the concrete in the amphitheater where we held our daily devotions and many other small jobs that were needed as we got God's property back into shape at the farm. In addition to the construction work, VBS was held for 4 days with a total of approximately 180 children who heard of God's love for them. Also, 4 days of ladies' crafts and devotions with 55 women attending.



We had beautiful weather while being the "Hands and Feet of our Lord". We were blessed by a wonderful inspiring church service in Quesada. The church was filled with well over 200 people including many youth, children and babies! It was such a beautiful thing to see so many people praising and worshipping our Lord!



Mary wanted me to express her love and gratitude for all your prayers and support. I know the team could feel your prayers all week long. The team saw some of the many ministries that Mary is supporting. None of this could be done without the support of churches like ours.

The dates for the 2020 trip are February 8-16, 2020. The team will be presenting our trip in the near future on a Sunday morning, you will hear and see more.


