On Sunday, I mentioned that we could do a whole sermon series on making Jesus the center of our lives. As I have been thinking on that statement, I was reminded of a text in Hebrews. The writer of Hebrews said, "Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and *go on to maturity*," (Hebrews 6:1, ESV). The King James says *go on to perfection*. Either way, this is what we mean by sanctification.

Notice in the text that maturity (or sanctification) is not something that accidentally happens. The text says to leave elementary teachings and go on to maturity. We have to take an active role in pursuing Christian maturity. So the question we must ask is how do we do that? I believe the answer lies in Spiritual disciplines.

Some spiritual disciplines are simple to understand and pursue. Spending time in the Scriptures is fairly straightforward. As followers of Jesus, we need to spend time in the Bible every day. This is why we have the daily Bible reading plan. This is a guide to help keep all of us in the Word and it is provoking questions and comments among church members as we all read the same thing. On multiple occasions in Bible study, someone will mention the daily reading text and how it applies to what we are studying that night. There are many different ways to read the Bible: straight through in a year, chronologically in a year, Old Testament and New Testament texts every day. You should mix it up and try different plans, but be in the Word of God every day.

There are other disciplines that are not so simple to understand. Why are Wesley groups so effective? What is it about confessing our sin to close Christian companions that is beneficial to the sanctification process? I don't know, but I do know it works. Just ask any Twelve Step proponent and they will tell you it is essential to recovery.

Then there are disciplines that I have so little experience with that I cannot say how to implement them in the Christian life. But this is the exciting thing about the Christian life: it is a journey and there is always room for more growth. Right now, God is working in an area of my life that, after some more practice, I will be ready to talk about. But for now, know that God is calling us to be transformed into the image of Christ, which takes discipline. So get on the daily reading plan, join a small group, and spend time in prayer. Let's move towards maturity together.

This time of year, food pantries' supplies are often sparse, so please give generously.




<u>Church</u> Thanksgiving Meal

Jesus modeled - for people in His culture and in ours today - the importance of eating with one another. Social status was never a deterrent for Jesus, neither was religious status nor gender. Jesus dined with all, broke bread for all. After Jesus' resurrection, John lets us in on a beach breakfast Jesus had prepared for his fishing friends. Not the Hebrew Scriptures, the Gospels, nor the Acts of the Apostles are lacking invitations to come eat with one another.

Thankfully, that invitation is one we gladly carry on today in our church tradition. On Sunday nights, volunteers provide meals for kids and youth and their adult leaders. Each Wednesday night, our congregation shares a meal together. Leading up to Thanksgiving, our Stewardship & Missions class and youth group will be sorting food at Hillcrest Bruce to send food baskets to dozens of families in our community so they, too, have the chance to break bread together over the special holiday weekend.

I am so easily swept up in the multi-tasking nature of our society, I sometimes eat without considering the work, sacrifice, and care that went into the food entering my mouth or the people I'm sharing it with. How many hands were involved in growing, harvesting, transporting, and selling these ingredients to me? How far did it travel to make it to my plate? Do the people who picked my vegetables have enough to feed their families, too? How is the soul of the person sitting across the table from me?

Next time we sit down to eat, may we remember the sacredness of our action and in the same breath give thanks to God for His provision, crying to God for those who are hungry at this very moment. May we be intentional in our breaking of bread and sharing a meal, and may we be moved to give.













Dear Brothers and Sisters, I pray God has held and blessed you as He will in this Thanksgiving season. We all are so blessed to have a God who loves, holds, and protects us every day of our lives that He has given to us. All is His.

Work at the Costa Rica camp continues as they build, not only physical structures, but also bonds with the Costa Rican people. Joel has received high praise for his work and commit-

ment to our Lord. He has been leading young adult groups and even preached in Pital on Sunday, October 15. I was told he did a marvelous job, which is no surprise to you or me, I am sure.



The Pital feeding program continues to operate and grow in the number of children you are supporting. I thank God every day for my amazing, giving, and caring church family. It warms my heart when Natalia sends me pictures of these children literally being fed along with their souls being fed as well. All the smiles are worth a million dollars to me. This would not be happening without all of you. Thanks does not seem enough, but that's all I can say.

I have prayed many times that God would give me more eloquent words or style to convey my thoughts. It just has not happened. I suppose He wants me to stay the dumb Kentucky man for some reason. I am sure it is His plan. God has often led me to 1 Corinthians 1:28-31: God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things - and the

things that are not - to nullify the things that are, so that no one may boast before him. It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God - that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption. Therefore, as it is written: 'Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord.'

I read in the footnotes that this verse suggests that God prefers to use people and things considered lowly or weak by society's standards to accomplish His purposes. I equate that to mean, not only was I lowly, but I also argued with God about not being the person for His job in missions. I learned He has given me more than I need for His purposes. He can and does the same for all of us. That gave me comfort when I finally understood what God was saying.

As I was finishing this article, I received the sad, heartbreaking news that Teresa Kirkpatrick had gone to be with our Lord. Sad for us, but a day of celebration for her. She has been an integral part of the Costa Rica mission team, having been a member for fourteen of our trips. She loved helping with VBS and the Feeding Program and being a member of the Painting Sisters. She especially loved holding the babies! Teresa will be missed by all. Please keep Larry and the rest of Teresa's family lifted up in your prayers.

Your team's plan for the February 2024 trip continues well. At this point, there are 17 from our church and area. We also have five from Georgia joining us and maybe three from Maryland.


