As you read this, I am beginning my work at bettering my Spanish skills in order to pastor the Spanish-speaking community God is about to bring to CornerStone. I have been moved by the response of CornerStone church to the calling God first revealed to me that I then shared with all of you. Over 25 of you have participated in our basic Spanish phrases class in order to be ready to welcome Spanish speakers into our community. Many of you have told me that you are praying everyday for the new service and the work for which we are preparing. Some of you have even mentioned attending Spanish Immersion School the next time I go for more training.

While many of you have already received a call to action, we still need help. First and foremost, what I need from each of you is your prayers:

- Pray for me while I am in Spanish school that I am able to learn and absorb everything possible (or supernaturally more than is possible).
- Pray that the Spanish-speaking community would be drawn to worship here at CornerStone.
- Pray that God would bring us a person from the Hispanic community to participate in leading worship.

We are also planning to have fellowship between the 8:00 a.m. bilingual and 9:30 a.m. traditional worship services. I need people to bring snacks, muffins, granola bars, or other breakfast appropriate items. If you would like to make coffee, please let me know. If you attend 9:30 worship, I need you to stop in the Family Life Center before you go to the sanctuary, get a cup of coffee, and say hello during our fellowship time

I also need people to come to the 8:00 a.m. worship. I am not asking you to give up "your" worship service. Double dipping is okay. But we need people in the 8:00 a. m. service at least until it gets established.

Finally, I need you to be patient with me as we move into this new era in the life of CornerStone. We are entering the unknown together, but my confidence is that God, who called us here, will lead us together.

Three Things to Do During a Sermon An Active Listening Thought from Pastor John

Does your mind wander when you sit still? Does your mind ever wander when you are sitting in the pew during a sermon? If it does, you are not alone. I have a very active mind, and I can bounce from subject to subject in a heartbeat. Ever wonder why clergy wear robes and stoles? Squirrel! Sorry about that.

The average attention span for Americans has greatly decreased over the years. According to research, over the last 15 years our attention has diminished by a whopping 25%. There are distractions everywhere, even at our fingertips - namely our phones, tablets, TV remotes, and so on. There are even distractions in the sanctuary: the shadow of a bird flying by the stained glass, a phone ringing, or a someone talking. It takes time to reset our attention when distractions derail our focus. Jesus said after teaching a couple of parables, "Consider carefully how you listen" (i.e. Luke 8:18). **Read Romans 12:2**, **Colossians 3:2, and 1 Peter 4:11.**

So how can you stay focused during the sermon? I have three things to help you maintain focus.

- 1. Open your Bible and follow along with the Scripture reading, even if it is a different translation. At CornerStone ,we mostly preach from the ESV. Keep it open throughout the sermon. Something may catch your eye and transform your mind. When the preacher pauses after reading the Scripture, whisper a prayer like, "Lord, speak to me this morning." Prepare yourself to be receptive to the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Take notes. I use my iPad and the Notability app to take sermon notes (and, for that matter, all my notes). Writing down significant things you hear and thoughts that are triggered by what you hear are so important to your spiritual journey.
- 3. Review your notes later in the week, reinforcing what the Holy Spirit was doing with you through the sermon. You are also renewing your mind by pondering on the sermon and Scripture. Lydia of Thyatira knew what it meant to actively listen and respond to a sermon. **Read Acts 16:13-15 and Acts 17:10-12.**

Let's make every sermon even more powerful by actively listening, faithfully responding, and lovingly sharing the sermon.

Questions of the day:

What am I hearing from God's Word and the preacher? What challenges am I hearing? How should the truth I hear today affect my choices and my life this week? Who can I share the message with in the next 24 hours?

I look forward to this continued journey with you and our growing CornerStone family.






SEPTEMBER Items of the month: SCHOOL SUPPLIES
